#### THE DEACON'S CORNER

July is a true Red, White, and Blue Month. July 4th is our Independence Day. July 14th is the anniversary of Bastille Day, the beginning of the French Revolution. Think of the Red, White and Blue of our Stars & Stripes and the French Tricolor. Throw in Keith Lockhart and the Boston Pops for good measure. The United States and France, two countries whose histories have been intertwined in North America since the beginning. Both days celebrate the casting off of the chains and tyranny of the past by our respective peoples.

The Marquis De Lafayette, a French nobleman, served on General Washington's staff. General Rochambeau and Admiral D'Estaing lent French soldiers and ships to the cause of Washington's victory at Yorktown. General Cornwallis' band played "The World Turned Upside Down" as his soldiers marched out of Yorktown to stack arms and surrender to the American "rabble" and their French allies.

American sentiment later ran decidedly in favor of the French Revolution, but there was precious little in military aid that we could offer. President Washington enforced a policy of strict neutrality toward France and England, primarily because we were in no position to fight another war with England.

The Motto of the French Republic, *Liberty, Brotherhood, Equality*, is in tune with the words of our own Declaration of Independence:

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

The values of both our countries have been severely tested in recent months. We find ourselves once again making common cause against an enemy who hates what we both stand for. Both countries would do well to get in touch with and stay in touch with those values we profess.

As for us members of the Body of Christ, we too need to remember the one who liberated us from the tyranny of sin, and wrestle with what exactly His commandments require of us. Love God! Love your neighbor! Love one another! What does that require of us as we struggle to live in an ever more violent world? At the same time, it is especially important (I think) for us to remember that God doesn't hate anyone. We are all His children and He loves us. Time to start affirming that in response to the hate which is all too prevalent in our midst.
