# FROM THE RECTOR The Reverend Sue Lederhouse

#### PENTECOST IS OVER – ADVENT IS HERE – CHRISTMAS IS COMING & SO IS EPIPHANY!

One of the things I seem to notice more and more as I get older is how quickly time seems to move. No more of those times of childhood when the clock never seemed to move and the days passed so slowly! And the church year right now mirrors that quick pace. December 2 marks the end of the "long green" season after Pentecost and the beginning of the Advent season and a new Church year. And the 4 weeks of Advent pass very quickly as we walk through December on the way to our Christmas celebration. This year, the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Advent is December 23 so we will have a quick transition from our Advent purple into the white of the Christmas Season on Christmas Eve, December 24. Because of the way the calendar falls, we will only have one Sunday in the Christmas season, on December 30. Then on January 6, we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany and march headlong into the Epiphany season. That's a lot of change in a month's time!

But we do have a theme that carries us through this fast moving month – and that's the theme of LIGHT. In Advent, we await a Savior that will bring us out of darkness into light. That light shines forth in the birth of Jesus (the Incarnation) that we celebrate at Christmas. And light continues to be a theme throughout the season of Epiphany as Jesus shows through His works of healing and ministry that He indeed is the light of the world. Finally on the Last Sunday after the Epiphany, we see this light most fully in the Transfiguration as the disciples see Jesus in a different light.

In our natural world, we experience much more darkness than light at this time of year. Sunlight is precious and it is quickly gone. The days are shorter and shorter until December 21 when we finally are on the upward path toward more sunlight and less darkness. One can understand how significant sunlight, moonlight, and starlight were for the ancient peoples in those days before electricity. As Herb Alpert once sang: "Doesn't it make you feel like trying to save the sunlight?"

What are the ways we are called to spread light into a darkened world? How are we called to bring the Light of Christ into a world that so desperately needs it?

A blessed Advent season to you and yours and a glorious Christmas to come –

Let us help each other to tend and nourish that Light in our own hearts and time and then, like the Evangelists, carry it out to a world that desperately needs it, is crying for it, is dying for it.

Let us be Keepers of that Light in our own time, and may the Peace of the Lord be always in your hearts.

- 6. Deacon Bob continues to alternate Sunday services as a parishioner in the pew, but we were happy to have him back preaching at yesterday's services for the first time since May, and hopefully back full time again early next year. Welcome back!
- 7. Viveanna Eloranta will be baptized on November 25, Christ the King Sunday, at the 10:00 service. Congratulations Viveanna!!
- 8. Bishop Gayle's mother passed away in early November. Posting with details is in the Narthex.
- 9. Thank you to all who participated, donated and helped to make the Friendly Kitchen Thanksgiving meal such a wonderful success! Thanks to generous donors, \$202.00 was collected to help with the expenses.
- 10. We received a nice letter from the Diocese thanking us for our donation of \$508.00 to the Merrimack Valley Disaster Relief Fund. This amount was collected through our loose plate donations from our September 16 church services. Thank you everyone for your donations!
- 11. There was a wonderful celebration with the St. Margaret's Friendly Kitchen team on November 12 for their last dinner. Thanks to Lynne Brune for organizing the cake and the cards.
- 12. Thank you also to Lynne for all her hard work getting St. Peter's authorized to receive food donations from the Greater Boston Food Bank. Our first pickup with be Tuesday, December 11 and will remain the second Tuesday of every month. This is a great resource and will help our Friendly Kitchen budget once it is up and running. - 13. Two of six Confirmation classes have been completed by 8 students. Thanks to Rev. Sue and to Lisa Platanitis and Melissa Scannell for their assistance in these classes.
- 14. The first planning meeting for the Paper Pantry on November 13 was very successful. If you are interested in joining us, we still need more helpers, so stay tuned for the next meeting. We have set an opening start date of Tuesday, February 19, from 3:00-6:00. Robin Higgins and Patti Metcalf will be working on creating a brochure for the Pantry. #### STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

#### ADVENT AT ST. PETER'S

Advent begins on December 2 this year. During Advent, we mark the change in season by some changes in our liturgy. Purple is the color for Advent, the color of penitence and of expectation. We use the color purple on every Sunday except the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent. On that Sunday, "Rejoice Sunday," we use the rose colored vestments and hangings. In Advent, we have no flowers on the altar in keeping with the penitential nature of this season. We will bless the Advent wreath on the First Sunday of Advent (December 2) at both services. Each week we will light a new candle on the Advent wreath (assisted at the 10 a.m. service by some of our parish families).

During Advent, we make a few changes in our worship. At the 8 a.m. service, we will use Eucharistic Prayer I (in the Prayer Book, p. 333). At the 10 a.m. service, we will be using Eucharistic Prayer 2 from *Enriching Our Worship* (pink insert). The choir will again be doing a special introit ("Christ is Coming — Prepare the Way") each Sunday immediately before our opening hymn. For our service music, we will use the Schubert settings of the Kyrie, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei and for a post-communion piece, the Taize chant, "Wait for the Lord." These will be printed as a music insert in the bulletin. At the Presentation, we will sing one verse of "Come Thou Long Expected Jesus" (Hymnal #66) as we have done in previous years. It will be printed in the bulletin.

**A:** Who is eligible to participate: Anyone who is a Bourne or Wareham resident and is currently receiving Mass Health/SNAP benefits. Proof of eligibility must be presented upon the request of any supplemental paper/personal care items that we distribute. This program is not meant to supply families with all paper or personal care items, but merely an attempt to try to supplement, in some small way, products to alleviate their needs.

#### B. How can you as parishioners get involved?

- 1. Volunteers are still needed to assist us one time per month on the third Tuesday of each month during the hours of the Paper Pantry from 3:00-6:00 pm, held here at the church. You don't need to help every month or for all three hours, but any time you can volunteer will be appreciated.
- 2. Once a month we will be notifying you through the church bulletin and the online weekly Blast of monthly items needed to help keep our Paper Pantry supplies well stocked.

If donating your time does not work for you, but you want to help, you may prefer to donate either a requested item that is needed or make a monetary or gift card donation and we will shop for you!!

**Reminder:** This ministry is not going to be supported by our current church budget, but is by your donations, any possible grants we can seek, and by soliciting our neighboring businesses.
