# Substance Abuse Prevention and Support Group

Several years ago, a group of parishioners, concerned about the growing problems surrounding substance abuse issues, joined together to study ways that St. Peter's could help. Education opportunities were developed and presented to the congregation, and a fundraising campaign was begun to support the Bourne Substance Free Coalition.

The year 2020 began with our usual meetings held on the third Monday of each month. Due to the Corona Virus, in-building meetings were suspended and our group has become temporarily inactive. With the generosity of parishioners, \$149.50 was raised through our once-a-month collection jug for the Bourne Substance Free Coalition.

During the Pandemic we have not been able to have a collection for the Bourne Substance Free Coalition. We encourage everyone to look for local substance abuse related charities and make a direct donation if able. There have been several articles in the Cape Cod Times organizations that help young mothers struggling with addiction during the pandemic.

Please continue to hold all who suffer and their families in your prayers. We hope to regroup soon, watch the weekly E-blasts for details.

The pandemic has increased the need to find ways to support those suffering from addiction as well as their families. With health care lost due to job loss and people struggling with the economy, many have fallen back on cheap street drugs to cope or to mask pain so that they can work. Please pray for those suffering and for their families.

I would like to thank the parish and members of our group, Celeste and Jim Hankey, Jane and Jim Lema, Bob and Nancy Sherwood, and Donna Beers for their dedication and efforts to keep this important issue in our minds and prayers. Also, a big thank you to our treasurer Dianne Cartmell and Robin Higgins and Sue Hebb for helping get the information out to parishioners. Please Keep all those dealing with this disease in your prayers.
